# 23/231 PUBLIC SPEAKING

A member of the public raised the following issues;

- The future of the Brailsford Institute in the light of new requirements for major structural works
- Road safety and speeding with particular reference to the junctions of Luke Lane and The Green with the A52.

**The Institute**. Cllr Laughlin explained the understanding of Councillors of the roles of the Parish Council and the Institute's Management Committee. Cllr White reported on the work he was undertaking for the Institute Committee and agreements made at the last Institute meeting with the aim of expediting activity which would determine whether a refurbishment or redevelopment scheme would be taken forward. Cllr Laughlin identified that with the S106 monies a potential £200k was available for improvement works. It was noted that following a fire safety report some significant structural works were need to ensure compliance with new Fire Safety Regulations for public buildings.

**Road Safety and Speeding.** The Parish Council's current plans were discussed, namely the installation of a further Speed Indicator Device (SID) at the western end of the village; a traffic survey; a community speed watch programme; and measures to manage speed at the western end of the village near the Avant estate. The latter included a repositioning of the 30 mph signs and a repainting of the relevant road markings.

# 23/235 BRAILSFORD INSTITUTE UPDATE

The priority was now to progress a refurbishment/redevelopment plan and to develop a costed plan for compliance with the Fire Safety regulations.

# 23/236 PLANNING APPLICATION FOR LAND SOUTH OF MAIN ROAD - 23/00616/OUT

Cllr Laughlin reminded the meeting that members were asked to identify potential traffic consultants to help the Council build its road safety case. It was agreed that encouragement should continue to be given to Highways Officers to attend a meeting and advice the Parish Council on the rationale for its current position on road safety on the A52 alongside the Avant estate.

# 23/236 PARISH SURVEY /QUESTIONNAIRE

Questionnaires were still being returned. A report from the Clerk was expected on the preliminary findings which it was hoped could be discussed at the January meetings.

# 23/237 SIDs

A provisional order had been placed with Westcotec. Some further queries had been raised by the supplier and the Clerk had advised that these were being dealt with.

# 23/238 AVANT ESTATE - FOOTPATHS

Cllr White confirmed that a meeting had been held on site with Cllr Bond who had reviewed the potential solutions. As confirmed in recent correspondence, Cllr Bond felt that the route required by the Planning Conditions would be the easier option to deliver.

Cllr Laughlin suggested that the residents of the estate should consider applying 'people power' as recommended by our MP to raise the level of interest in considering alternative solutions.

# 23/239 CAMERON HOMES APPLICATION

Cllr Woodhouse reported that the status of the application was unclear. Cllr Laughlin would seek to obtain a definitive answer from the Planning Author.

# 23/240 BUS SHELTERS

A contractor will be commissioned to undertake this work.

#### 23/241 CHRISTMAS TREES

Cllr Laughlin reaffirmed the decision taken that the Parish Council woud not provide trees this year and effort would be focused on the street trees as installed. However queries had been raised with her and disappointment expressed that no decorated trees would be provided, It was understood that the Institute would be installing a tee as in previous years.

#### 23/242 HEDGE CUTTING

Luke Lane hedge cutting had been planned for the weekend of 8-10.12.23. However in the absence of the Clerk it was unclear if notification had been given to neighbouring households, it was agreed to delay this work. Cllrs Laughlin and Thompson will followup.

It was understood that the Clerk had submitted a request for the District Council to undertake hedge cutting along the A52.

Cllr Laughlin proposed that costs should be obtained to clear soil from the A52 footpaths to improve access. This was agreed.
